For the past 29 years she has lived at Main Street CILA group home with 7 peers. She attended William M. BeDell-ARC 5 days a week doing assembly work which she enjoyed.

Karen liked walking around her home and talking, even though only those closest to her at the home could partially understand what she was saying. She also liked helping others. She loved to eat, with ice cream being her favorite food. Her favorite staff member was Asia. When Asia wasn't working Karen was always looking for her and asking where she was.

Karen was the daughter of Harvey and Lorraine (nee Korte) Jakel. She was preceded in death by her twin sister Sharon who died at 13 days of age, her father Harvey Jakel on 7/1/2009, her mother Lorraine Jakel on 5/28/2014, and her sister-in-law Marion (nee Allen) Jakel on 11/2/2008.
