Alan L. Loeh, age 78 of Highland, IL, died Tuesday, December 22, 2015, at Faith Countryside Homes/Faith Care Center in Highland, IL.

He was born on Saturday, November 20, 1937, in Litchfield, IL, the son of Herman and Hazel (nee Best) Loeh.

On Saturday, July 20, 1968, he married Mary E. Loeh, nee Alberternst, who passed away on Thursday, October 14, 2010.

He was a member of Saint Paul Catholic Church, Highland, IL; American Society of Clinical Pathologists.

Alan was born in Litchfield, IL; he grew up in Livingston, IL. At the age of 13, he moved to Staunton, IL. He graduated from Staunton High School in 1955. He graduated from Gradwahl School of Laboratory Technology, St. Louis, MO. He received a Bachelor of Arts in Chemistry & Zoology; Master of Science in Microbiology (1965), both degrees from SIU-E. He worked for St. Joseph Hospital, Highland, IL, for over 40 years, retiring in 2002, as the Head of Laboratory. As a youth, he was drafted by the St. Louis Browns baseball team as a shortstop. He played baseball and softball until in his 60's. He enjoyed fishing; hunting; was very good at archery; watching his grandchildren many sporting events. He attended Senior Renewal at St. Joseph Hospital, it was a
