Bruce Dexter King, age 74 of Highland, IL, died Saturday, November 1, 2025, at Anderson Hospital in Maryville, IL.

He was born on Friday, December 29, 1950, in Savannah, GA, the son of Tholan and Carolyn (nee Fountain) King.

Bruce was born in Savannah, Georgia and grew up as part of a dear, loving, household, surrounded by his parents, brother Clay and extended family of very close aunts, uncles, grandmother and cousins. He graduated from Windsor Forest High School, where he was elected class president in his senior year.
