Carol enjoyed traveling with her husband, visiting every US state except two, and numerous countries across four continents. After retirement, they spent winters in Florida and attended St. Louis Cardinals' spring training every year as she was a lifelong fan.

Carol battled COPD her whole life resulting from a childhood illness, and worked hard every day, particularly later in life, to maintain her health and courageously fight that battle. All who knew Carol appreciate what a kind and gentle soul she was.
