Dennis L. Pollmann, age 73 of Marine, IL, died Sunday, February 18, 2024, at his home, in Marine, IL.

He was born on Saturday, June 10, 1950, in Highland, IL, the son of Lawrence and Esther (nee Iberg) Pollmann.

Mr. Pollmann was born in Highland, IL, he graduated from Highland High School in 1968. From 1970 - 1973, he serviced with the US Air Force earning the rank of Sgt.
