June 10, 1919 - May 18, 2006

Mrs. Harriet Amelia (Venzlaff) Wallis, age 86, of Florissant, MO., died Thursday, May 18, 2006, at Alhambra Care Center in Alhambra, IL.

She was born June 10, 1919, in St. Louis, MO., the daughter of Harry and Lena (Schoellhammer) Venzlaff.

On April 15, 1946, she married Roy William Wallis, who passed away January 28, 2000.

She was a former member Bellefontaine Baptist Church, the choir and Christian Northwest Hospital Auxiliary.

She was born and raised in North St. Louis and graduated at 16 years of age from Beaumont High School where she was a member of the National Honor Society and Bicycle Club.

Church where she sang in the choir and volunteered at Christian Northwest Hospital.

She lived her life in the North St. Louis area until her husband died in 2000 when she divided her time between her son in Florissant, MO and her daughter in Alhambra, IL. She attended Highland Community Church, Highland, IL, while in the area.
