One cold winter afternoon we were eating lunch in the big log truck (called the old grey mare), in a Jamestown bottom timber. Leonard, sitting in the drivers seat, was busy eating and looking at me (I am about age 13) while he told a story. Meanwhile, several deer came by right up to the left side front of the truck. He had not noticed yet. One deer even started licking the left front head light. It was a very special moment when he looked to see what I was staring at.
