Rev. Russell Dean Carnagey, age 77, of O'Fallon, Missouri died Friday, April 27, 2012 in St. Louis, Missouri. He was born July 16, 1934 in Hammond, Indiana the son of Richard D. and Margaret Reeves Carnagey.

Rev. Carnagey taught school at Noble School in Indianapolis, Indiana for five years. He taught at the Bible Institute in Roxana, Illinois for five years. He was principle for eight years and an administrator for seven years and taught for a total of 30 years at Faith Christian School in Florissant, Missouri. On July 9, 1957 he was ordained. He pastored at Devington Baptist Church and Windsor Village Church both in Indianapolis, Indiana. He then pastored at First Baptist Church in Alhambra, Illinois where he pastored for a total of 13 years from 1962 to 1978. He pastored for 23 years at Lackland Road Baptist Church. He was a member of American Assoc. of Christian Schools where he had a permanent credential. He was ordained through General Assoc. of Regular Baptist. He served 30 years on the Faith Christian School Board, 40 years as program chairman of Camp Manitoumi in Peoria, Illinois, 42 years on Executive Community American Council of Christian Church and was on the cemetery committee for Harris Cemetery. He was also a member of Faith Baptist Church of Bridgeton, Missouri.

Survivors include sons, Michael T. Carnagey (Karren) and Richard D. Carnagey (Kim); sister, Dorothy Jean Cunningham (Ronald); three

grandchildren, Rebecca, Ryan and Lauren Carnagey and son-in-law, Steve Lowen. He was preceded in death by his wife, JoAnne L. Kuhn Carnagey; his parents and one daughter, Cheryl L. Lowen.
