Virgil Louis Schoen, age 54, of Pocahontas, IL., died Saturday, February 18, 2006.

He was born April 21, 1951, in Highland, IL., the son of Arthur and Ethel (Mollet) Schoen.

On November 9, 1979, he married Nancy E. Schoen, nee Goodin, who survives.

He was a supporter of 4-H and FFA. He judged art at Madison and Montgomery County Fairs. He liked genealogy and gardening. Virgil was a perfectionist and everything he did he wanted it done right.
